

The Mud Strap Sleeves

You can add Mud Strap Sleeves to improve your Mud Strap fit. If your horse has sensitive skin, they can also help to reduce rubbing.

HOW TO APPLY:

Apply a small amount of lubricant (such as cooking oil or hand cream) to the end of the Mud Strap and then feed it through the tubing.

Thank You For Choosing Scoot Boots!

The Scoot Boot Mud Strap provides extra security when riding over rough terrain, deep mud and water. It can also prevent losing a boot in the instance a horse overreaches.

It is designed to stretch when placed under load and, if secured correctly, won't affect the horse's pasterns.

How to Put on Your Mud Straps

Follow these 5 simple steps to fit your Mud Straps to your Scoot Boots:

1. **Pass both ends of the strap** on each side of the rear vertical shank, passing under the Trail Gaiter. This is how the strap should fit with your Trail Gaiter.



Make sure that the loops of the Mud Strap are facing upwards and over the front of the boot.



2. **Slip the hoof into the boot and place on the ground.** Bring each end of the straps towards the front of the boot with the strap on each side of the pastern - make sure the straps are even.



3. **Slip both ends of the strap back through the 'collar'** (one at a time) and then push the collar upwards towards the coronet.



4. **Slide each end of the Mud Strap one at a time** over the bottom front strap and then secure the front strap. Secure the top front strap over the mud strap. The front of your boot should look like this!



TIP #1

Make sure you can easily slide a finger between the mud strap and the pastern around the whole pastern. If the mud strap feels tight against your finger, you need a bigger size. Contact us if you need to exchange the strap!

TIP #2

Your Scoot Boots can be easily removed or fitted with the mud strap and 'collar' still attached. This will save you time!
